Did you know...?

...that WiFi Hotspots are available to borrow from PYPL?

The facts: Borrowers are required to sign a Borrowing Terms Form at the time of first checkout, the loan period is 1 week with one renewal, hotspots must be returned to a staff member at the circulation desk, late fees are \$1.00 per day, and holds can be placed on hotspots. Users are responsible for replacement costs of lost or damaged devices or device accessories.

...that you can borrow new books from 22 (and counting) other libraries in the Southern Tier Library System?

The facts: PYPL patrons can put holds on new books owned by other libraries now. This speeds up the time patrons have to wait for a copy of a popular new title because instead of just waiting for the PYPL copy, several copies are available to borrow by patrons of all the Reciprocal Borrowing libraries. PYPL patrons are already seeing shorter wait times for new titles.
